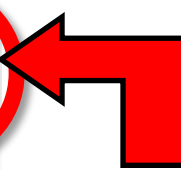
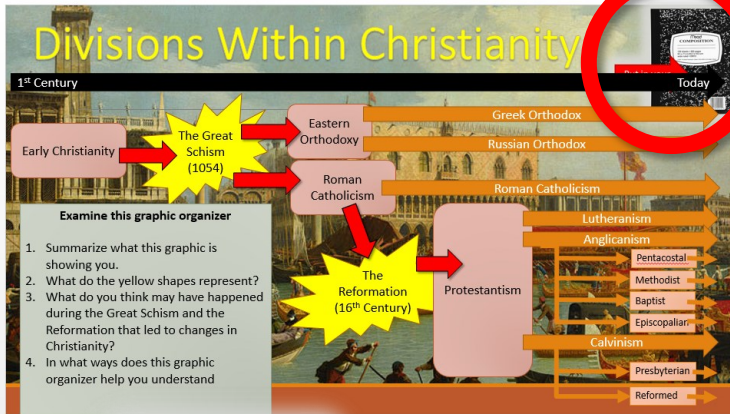


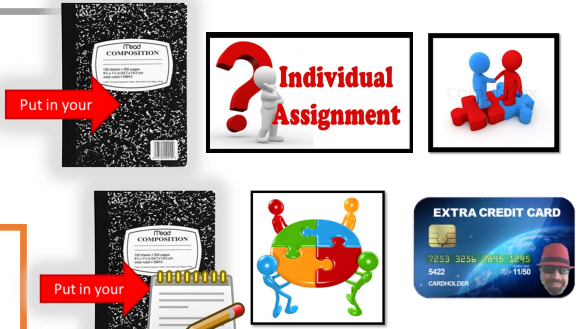
Do I turn this in?



For some reason, we are still having difficulty understanding what gets turned in and when. I'm not sure why this is. It seems pretty obvious, but clearly it isn't. So here is a chart explain how to know what to turn in and what to keep in your notebook.



First, everything I give you to do will have one of these little symbols in the top right hand corner.



They will be one of these



This is a Bell Ringer symbol. You put these in your notebook. You can tell because the little arrow says, "Put in your" and points to a notebook.



This symbol is very similar, but designates notes that I want you to put in your notebook. Same idea. Little arrow.



When you see this symbol, this is an Assignment. This is done by you, individually, and turned in either electronically or via hard copy in the assignments box. It must be turned in by the due date. It does **NOT** go in your notebook.



These symbols indicate a collaborative assignment, either a Pair-Up (Top) or a Group Project (Bottom). These are turned in electronically or via hard copy on the assigned due date, just like assignments. They do **NOT** go in your notebook.



This indicates an extra credit assignment. It can be done individually or collaboratively, but it must be turned in by the due date. Again, it does **NOT** go in your notebook.

So, it's pretty simple. If you see a notebook on the top right hand corner of the activity given, then that goes in your notebook. If you do not see a notebook, it gets turned in. You can turn things in by sharing them with me using Google Aps. You can submit them on Classroom. You can e-mail them to me. Or, if you are old school, you can turn in a written "hard" assignment and put it in the assignment box on the back counter. The box is clearly marked ASSIGNMENTS.
